Yours of June 28th about the Bisect cover. About all that I can add is that of course the second cover was Lot 78 in the Emerson sale and Judge Emerson paid \$600 for it. Where he got it I do not know - it could have been Nassau.

The first cover was Hinds, then Brandebury and then I bought it. I have a faint recollection that you sold it for me on a fifty-fifty basis, and don't you think you sold it to Harold Stark?

S.B.A. Wrote Jessup May 12, 1950: "Re - the 12d Bisect - Brandebury cover - Lot 76 in the Doane sale of Dec. 6. 1943. Yes Ed. I think that the cover is genuine beyond any question of a doubt. Without reference to my files. I think I have the history of this cover. going way back. I think Brandy bought it in the Hind sale. Because the 12¢ split is not tied tight the cover never brought what it should, always sold too cheap. The cover shows that 10d was prepaid in stamps - no evidence that a pair of 3¢ were used. I wouldn't stake my life on it

but I would wager my reputation. Glancing at my files I note it sold @ \$18.50 in the Hunter Sale in 1900. I think it is now in Harold Stark's collection but I did not sell it to him. No doubt he obtained it from Ezra."

Brandebury - Ex-Hind (Bought by E.Cole @ \$120) Ezra Cole wrote Krug under date of Dec. 26.1943: "I also want to write you something about the 12¢ bisect cover. Notice the date. This is a very early use of the 12d stamp. The strip of 1¢ blues is a beautiful thing in itself. This was Arthur Hind's cover. He bought it from Colson in 1921 and I could look up his cost but no doubt it was plenty anyway. Brandy paid \$185 for it at that sale. Stan could improve the looks of this cover a great deal. If a bisect stamp tempts you at all this is one to be baited with, for it is pretty and most bisects aren't.
