Chase writes 3/23-1937 - "TRIE is in France, down near the Spanish border - Godden's envelope was very obviously missent to Aachen. I guess the 5¢ xx was added - The postmark is not in the same axis - as the others and is I suppose copied from those on the strip. The "L" and "La" is very different in the two postmarks - measure them with calipers and you will see what I mean. I guess "France" is written at the left of AACHEN

# *1858 5c Brick Red --- Earliest Usage*

In our list of last week we recorded the earliest known usage of the 5c Brick Red (Scott's No. 27) as October 6, 1858, this cover being in the Hollowbush collection. Mr. Hollowbush now shows us a cover with a 5c Brick Red used in combination with a vertical strip of three of the 10c, all nicely tied with a postmark of April 6 (1858). This is six months earlier than the previous early recording. We certainly trust that our students will check our list of "earliest usages" and advise us if they can better any of the dates we have given.
